9. COURSE REQUIREMENT

9.1. Rules of class participation

- Students are responsible for attending the complete session.
- Despite the reason or no reason, absent students are considered not completing the course and must enroll again.
- Students who do not participate in the final test shall be considered not completing the course and must enroll again.
- Students are responsible for actively researching documents, proactively preparing lessons before going to class according to the instructions and requests of lecturers

Students will be asked to answer random questions and answers during eight sessions

- Regarding the exchange between lecturers and students: Encourage students to participate in discussions, give teachers direct feedback about the module's content, teaching and learning methods, teaching and reading materials. Lecturers also encourage students to give feedback on the form, methods, and contents of the tests and evaluate students' learning results. Students can communicate with lecturers in

class, during office hours, or via email. The valuable student feedback contributes to improving the teaching and learning quality of the module.
